

THREE EASY STEPS TO RECEIVE YOUR CME CREDIT

1. Sign in at the registration table. (Look for the balloons.) You only need to sign in once during the entire symposium.
2. Print your name clearly and indicate your AOA member number on the CME Verification Request Form to receive credit.
3. Complete the CME Verification Request Form (with your AOA number and email address). Indicate only the number of hours you attended, sign at the bottom and turn in with your evaluation packet at the Registration Desk before you leave. Based on the book, *The Family Gene: A Mission to Turn My Deadly Inheritance Into a Hopeful Future*, celebrated author Joselin Linder will team up with geneticist Andrea Amalfitano, DO, PhD, to discuss how her father's mysterious illness set her on a path to investigate its origins and hopefully stop the disease before it kills her too.

JOSELIN LINDER | Joselin Linder is a regular contributor to the *New York Post*, whose work has also been featured on *This American Life, Morning Edition* and *Life of the Law*. A Columbus, Ohio, native, she now lives in Brooklyn with her husband and two dogs. Joselin is the daughter of the late William Linder, DO, who practiced medicine at Doctor Hospital in Columbus.

ANDREA AMALFITANO, DO, PHD | Dr. Amalfitano is the Osteopathic Heritage Foundation Endowed Professor of Pediatrics, Microbiology and Molecular Genetics at Michigan State University. His expertise as both a clinician and scientist is particularly noteworthy. His work includes clinical and experimental genetics, immunology, and technology development for use in genetic diseases, cancer and infectious diseases. Dr. Amalfitano has served as principal investigator on projects ranging from basic investigations, preclinical studies and human clinical trials that led to the development of FDA-approved therapies.

DERMATOLOGY ROUNDTABLE

Dawn L. Sammons, DO ('03), FAOCD serves as course director for this unique workshop designed to encourage interaction, group discussion and problem-solving. Dr. Sammons leads a team of expert faculty who will move from group to group and teach participants how to identify and treat the most common skin disorders seen in primary care. Focus will be on recognizing and beginning initial treatment of the less common, but more serious, skin disorders and determining which patients should be referred for dermatology consultation. Identification of malignant and premalignant skin tumors will be covered, as well as evaluation of appropriate biopsy options, management options and referral criteria.
